Severe Reporting Discrepancies: COGAT Review Reveals Nearly 6,000 Aid Trucks Omitted from UN Reports Since May



Against the backdrop of criticism and statements by the international community and UN bodies claiming that Israel is not allowing the required quantities of humanitarian aid into the Gaza Strip, a comprehensive review conducted by the Coordinator of Government Activities in the Territories (COGAT) exposes a dramatic gap between the actual number of aid trucks entering Gaza and the figures presented by the UN.

Since May, according to UN data, only 3,553 trucks entered the Gaza Strip. In reality, Israel facilitated the entry of nearly 9,200 trucks. This represents a gap of almost 6,000 trucks - 2.5 times the volume of aid that the UN claims actually entered. The fact that the UN presents only part of the aid actually transferred misleads the international community and creates a false picture of the situation, directly influencing global media coverage and shaping the positions of international decision-makers regarding the humanitarian situation in Gaza.

The UN publishes its figures through a public dashboard that purports to present a full picture of all humanitarian aid, but in practice it includes only the trucks facilitated by UN agencies and a small number of aid organizations working with them. The dashboard fails to include aid delivered by other actors in the humanitarian system, including various states, additional international organizations, the private sector, airdrops, and the distribution centers of the American company.

COGAT stresses that aid entry data is published regularly on a dedicated website, accessible to the public and the international community. This website provides a daily breakdown of the number of trucks entering Gaza, categorized by crossing point and type of goods. The data presented on the site reflects the full and accurate picture of the aid that Israel facilitates into the Gaza Strip.

UN data on the volume of aid, along with repeated statements and reports by senior members of the international community, are often presented as an indisputable absolute truth. However, a comprehensive and professional review reveals that the UN's documentation and monitoring mechanisms are deficient and present a misleading, partial, and at times inaccurate picture of the humanitarian situation in the Gaza Strip.
