

Humanitarian Efforts for Southern Gaza Strip - September 15, 2025

Essential infrastructure

- Operation of the Emirati water line from Egypt to the Al-Mawasi area. Connecting the line allows for a supply of 15 liters per person per day for 600,000 people
- Connecting the Kela power line to two desalination facilities in the Gaza Strip. Connecting the two lines allows for a daily supply of 26,000 cubic meters per day, instead of the 3,500 that were supplied before the line was connected to the two desalination plants
- Work to repair the water line from Israel to Bani Suheila has been completed, increasing the water supply to the southern Gaza Strip by 14,000 cubic meters
- Work continues to repair the Birkat Sa'id water line from Israel, which will also expand the water supply by an additional 14,000 cubic meters
- Coordinating the entry of fuel on an ongoing basis for the purpose of fueling desalination plants and operating water wells

Medical Response

- Four institutional hospitals (excluding the European Hospital),
 8 field hospitals and 3 central clinics in the humanitarian area
- Work has begun to reopen the European Hospital by local and international teams
- Thousands of tons of medical equipment and medicines have been brought in in recent weeks in cooperation with international organizations to strengthen the health systems in the southern Gaza Strip
- Over 250 beds were added to expand existing field hospitals.
 Over 300 additional beds are expected to be added in the coming days
- Planned an access route for the movement of patients and their caregivers in coordination with the Emirati Field Hospital
- The establishment of two additional field hospitals in southern Gaza Strip is expected in the coming weeks
- Regular entry of fuel for the operation of essential infrastructure in the Gaza Strip









Humanitarian Efforts for Southern Gaza Strip - September 15, 2025 **Shelters** Nearly 20,000 family tents and tarpaulins were brought in in cooperation with international organizations and donor countries Shelter complexes are currently being established in the southern Gaza Strip under Egyptian auspices Tens of thousands of additional tents were recently purchased by aid organizations and countries and are expected to enter the southern Gaza Strip over the next two weeks Planned - the entry of 100,000 new tents in the coming weeks for the population moving from north to south. Right now, the population from the north is moving based on existing tents in their possession, so this is an ongoing effort in parallel with the movement of the population
