Iranian Transactions and Sanctions Regulations

AGENCY: Office of Foreign Assets Control, Treasury.

ACTION: Final rule; stay of effectiveness.

SUMMARY: The Department of the Treasury's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) is indefinitely suspending five general licenses issued pursuant to the Iranian Transactions and Sanctions Regulations to align with changes in the foreign policy of the United States towards Iran.

DATES: Effective August 24, 2026, 31 CFR 560.544, 560.550, and 560.554 are stayed indefinitely.

As of August 24, 2026, the effectiveness of the Iran General Licenses F and G, published at 79 FR 11180 and 79 FR 49157, respectively, and available on OFAC's website (<https://ofac.treasury.gov>), are stayed indefinitely.

Background

On October 22, 2012, OFAC issued a final rule that amended the former Iranian Transactions Regulations, 31 CFR part 560 (ITR), and reissued them in their entirety as the Iranian Transactions and Sanctions Regulations (ITSR or "the Regulations") (77 FR 64664, October 22, 2012). Since then, OFAC has amended the Regulations on several occasions.

On February 27, 2014, OFAC published in the **Federal Register** General License F, which was issued pursuant to the Regulations on September 10, 2013 (79 FR 11180, February 27, 2014). On August 19, 2014, OFAC published in the **Federal Register** General License G, which was issued pursuant to the Regulations on March 19, 2014 (79 FR 49157, August 19, 2014). These general licenses were issued pursuant to the Regulations and are available on OFAC's website (www.treasury.gov/ofac).

Rules To Be Stayed

In response to Iran's continued disruptions to global energy markets, attacks on partners and allies in the Middle East, reconstitution of its conventional and nuclear weapons programs, efforts to monetize the Strait of Hormuz, and continued support to terrorist proxies, OFAC is indefinitely suspending the general licenses contained at 31 CFR 560.544, 560.550, and 560.554. These general licenses authorize, respectively, certain educational activities by U.S. persons in third countries; certain noncommercial, personal remittances to or from Iran; and the importation and exportation of services related to conferences in the United States or third countries. As a result of this suspension, any such transactions are no longer authorized by OFAC as of August 24, 2026.

In addition, OFAC is suspending indefinitely Iran General License F, published at 79 FR 11180, and Iran General License G, published at 79 FR 49157. These general licenses authorize, respectively, certain services in support of professional and amateur sports activities and exchanges involving the United and Iran, and certain academic exchanges and the exportation or importation of certain educational services. As a result of this suspension, any such transactions are no longer authorized by OFAC as of August 24, 2026.

Public Participation

Because the Regulations involve a foreign affairs function, the provisions of E.O. 12866 of September 30, 1993, "Regulatory Planning and Review" (58 FR 51735, October 4, 1993), as amended, and the Administrative Procedure Act (5 U.S.C. 553) requiring notice of proposed rulemaking, opportunity for public participation, and delay in effective date, as well as the provisions of E.O. 14192 of January 31, 2025, "Unleashing Prosperity Through Deregulation" (90 FR 9065, February 6, 2025) and E.O. 14219 of February 19, 2025, "Ensuring Lawful Governance and Implementing the President's 'Department of Government Efficiency' Deregulatory Initiative" (90 FR 10583, February 25, 2025) are inapplicable. Because no notice of proposed rulemaking is required for this rule, the Regulatory Flexibility Act (5 U.S.C. 601-612) does not apply.

Executive Order 14294

Section 5 of E.O. 14294 of May 9, 2025, "Fighting Overcriminalization in Federal Regulations" (90 FR 20367, May 14, 2025) directs that all future notices

of proposed rulemaking (NPRMs) and final rules published in the **Federal Register**, the violation of which may constitute criminal regulatory offenses, should include a statement identifying that the rule or proposed rule is a criminal regulatory offense and the authorizing statute. E.O. 14294 directs agencies to draft this statement in consultation with the Department of Justice.

E.O. 14294 further directs that the regulatory text of all NPRMs and final rules with criminal consequences published in the **Federal Register** after May 9, 2025 should explicitly state a mens rea requirement for each element of a criminal regulatory offense, accompanied by citations to the relevant provisions of the authorizing statute.

Willful violations of the regulations set forth in this final rule may be subject to criminal penalties pursuant to 50 U.S.C. 1705 and regulations promulgated thereunder. The statutory authority for criminal liability requires a mens rea of willfulness as an element pursuant to 50 U.S.C. 1705(c). In drafting this statement, OFAC has consulted with the Department of Justice.

Paperwork Reduction Act

The Paperwork Reduction Act does not apply because this rule does not impose information collection requirements that would require the approval of the Office of Management and Budget under 44 U.S.C. 3501 *et seq.*

Special Local Regulation; Lake Erie, Kelleys Island, OH

AGENCY: Coast Guard, Department of Homeland Security.

ACTION: Final rule.

SUMMARY: The Coast Guard is establishing a temporary special local regulation (SLR) for certain navigable waters of Lake Erie near Kelleys Island, OH. The SLR is needed to protect personnel, vessels, and the marine environment from potential hazards created by a sailing race. This rulemaking prohibits persons and vessels from being in the regulated area during the enforcement period unless specifically authorized by the Captain of the Port, Sector Detroit or their designated representative.

DATES: This rule is effective from 8:30 a.m. through 5 p.m. on August 29, 2026.

II. Background and Authority

On February 25, 2026, an organization notified the Coast Guard that they will be sponsoring a sailing race on Lake Erie near Kelleys Island, OH on August 29, 2026. The event will be held from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. on August 29, 2026. The race will include approximately 50 participants and 3 spectator craft. On June 25, 2026, the Coast Guard published a notice of proposed rulemaking (NPRM) titled Special Local Regulation; Lake Erie, Kelleys Island, OH (91 FR 38351). In that NPRM, we stated why we issued the NPRM and invited comments on our proposed regulatory action related to this sailing race.

Under the authority in 46 U.S.C. 70041, the COTP has determined that this rule is necessary to protect personnel, vessels, and the marine environment from potential hazards associated with the sailing race. No vessel or person will be permitted to enter the regulated area without obtaining permission from the COTP or their designated representative.

Because of the hazards associated with this event, the Coast Guard finds that under 5 U.S.C. 553(d)(3), good cause exists for making this rule effective less than 30 days after publication in the **Federal Register** because it is impracticable. We must establish this regulated area by August 29, 2026, to protect personnel, vessels, and the marine environment.

III. Discussion of Comments and the Rule

During the comment period that ended on July 27, 2026, we received two duplicate comments from the same individual.

The commenter expressed several concerns with the SLR, largely centered on the structure of the SLR and its potential impact on the local business community. Specifically, the commenter was concerned with the potential difficulty of enforcing a moving SLR, suggesting boaters may not know when they are within the exclusionary zone; the duration of the SLR; potential safety risks posed by requiring non-participant vessels to detour around the route; and the potential impact of the restrictions on the local business community on a peak summer tourism Saturday. The commenter questioned whether the Coast Guard could have used less restrictive alternatives, such as patrol boat escorts, broadcast notice to mariners, designated spectator zones, and small buffers. Finally, the commenter felt that the Coast Guard did

not provide adequate notice to the public of the proposed SLR, and that the NPRM should have contained more specific information, including the sponsoring organization's name. The commenter also believed that the NPRM was missing certain information, such as the number of participants and the racecourse coordinates.

The Coast Guard has complied with all applicable laws in establishing this SLR to protect vessels and property during a marine event. With respect to the structure of the SLR, a moving exclusion zone is common practice with sailing races. The public is on notice that this event is on August 29, 2026, and thus, should be mindful of where the participants and the exclusionary zone are located as they are transiting in the vicinity of the courses. The duration of the event is not set by the Coast Guard. It was provided by the sponsoring organization, and the time has been confirmed. The rule lasts only as long as the event.

Further, consistent with the “Impact on Small Entities” analysis in the NPRM, we expect limited economic impact on the Kelleys Island region. Although the course encompasses Kelleys Island, recreational vessels will be able to go around the event safely and easily as the regulated area is 100 yards around participants, not the entire course. The Coast Guard intends to have a patrol around the vessels. As noted in the NPRM, the Coast Guard will issue a Broadcast Notice to Mariners via VHF FM marine channel 16, which will allow small entities to adjust their transit plans, and the rule allows vessels to request permission to enter the regulated area from the COTP or the COTP's designated representative. The COTP determined a designated spectator zone is not necessary as the only spectators for the event are the designated safety boats provided by the event sponsor. The Coast Guard has utilized the least restrictive mechanism to protect personnel, vessels, and the marine environment from potential hazards created by a sailing race. This appropriately balances the interests of all entities while providing necessary protection for personnel, vessels, and the marine environment from the potential hazards of a sailing race.

The Coast Guard disagrees with the commenter's assertion that the public was not provided adequate notice of the rule. The Coast Guard provided notice of the event on June 25, 2026, and provided a reasonable period of time for public comment. The Coast Guard received only one comment, which was comprehensive in scope. The commenter does not indicate what

On August 24, 2026, OFAC issued GL AA to authorize certain transactions otherwise prohibited by Executive Order (E.O.) 13902 of January 10, 2020, “Imposing Sanctions With Respect to Additional Sectors of Iran” (85 FR 2003, January 14, 2020) that are ordinarily incident and necessary to the wind down of transactions, or maintenance of operations, involving certain entities through 12:01 a.m. eastern daylight time, October 23, 2026. OFAC also issued GL BB to authorize, through 12:01 a.m. eastern daylight time, September 8, 2026, certain transactions otherwise prohibited by the Iranian Transactions and Sanctions Regulations (ITSR), 31 CFR part 560, that are ordinarily incident and necessary to the wind down of transactions that were previously authorized by the general

licenses listed in GL BB. These GLs were made available on OFAC's website (<https://ofac.treasury.gov>) when they were issued. The text of these GLs is provided below.

GENERAL LICENSE AA

Authorizing Certain Activities Involving La Nivernaise De Raffinage SAS

(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this general license, all transactions prohibited by Executive Order (E.O.) 13902 that are ordinarily incident and necessary to the wind down of any transaction, or the maintenance of operations, contracts, or other agreements in effect as of August 24, 2026, involving La Nivernaise De Raffinage SAS (“LNR”), or any entity in which LNR owns, directly or indirectly, a 50 percent or greater interest, are authorized through 12:01 a.m. eastern daylight time, October 23, 2026.

(b) This general license does not authorize any transactions otherwise prohibited by E.O. 13902, including transactions involving any person blocked pursuant to E.O. 13902 other than the blocked persons described in paragraph (a) of this general license, unless separately authorized.

GENERAL LICENSE BB

Authorizing the Wind Down of Certain Transactions Previously Authorized Under the Iranian Transactions and Sanctions Regulations

(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b), all transactions prohibited by the Iranian Transactions and Sanctions Regulations, 31 CFR part 560 (the ITSR), that are ordinarily incident and necessary to the wind down of any transaction previously authorized by one or more of the following general licenses are authorized through 12:01 a.m. eastern daylight time, September 8, 2026, provided that any payment to a blocked person is made into a blocked interest-bearing account located in the

United States in accordance with the ITSR:

(1) 31 CFR 560.544 (“Certain educational activities by U.S. persons in third countries authorized”);

(2) 31 CFR 560.550 (“Certain noncommercial, personal remittances to or from Iran authorized”);

(3) 31 CFR 560.554 (“Importation and exportation of services related to conferences in the United States or third countries authorized”);

(4) Iran General License F (“Authorizing certain services in support of professional and amateur sports activities and exchanges involving the United States and Iran”); or

(5) Iran General License G (“Certain academic exchanges and the exportation or importation of certain educational services authorized”).

(b) This general license does not authorize any other transactions or activities prohibited by the ITSR, any other Executive order, or any other part of 31 CFR chapter V, unless separately authorized.

Background

On January 10, 2020, the President, invoking the authority of, *inter alia*, the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (50 U.S.C. 1701 *et seq.*) (IEEPA), issued Executive Order (E.O.) 13902 of January 10, 2020, "Imposing Sanctions With Respect to Additional Sectors of Iran" (85 FR 2003, January 14, 2020). Among other prohibitions, section 1(a)(i) of E.O. 13902 blocks, with certain exceptions, all property and interests in property that are in the United States, that come within the United States, or that are or come within the possession or control of any U.S. person of any person determined by the Secretary of the Treasury, in consultation with the Secretary of State to operate in the construction, mining, manufacturing, or textiles sectors of the Iranian economy, or any other sector of the Iranian economy as may be determined by the Secretary of the Treasury, in consultation with the Secretary of State.

On August 24, 2026, the Director of OFAC, in consultation with the Department of State and pursuant to 31 CFR 560.802, determined that section 1(a)(i) of E.O. 13902 shall apply to the aviation, digital asset, gold, shipping, and technology sectors of the Iranian economy. This determination took effect on August 24, 2026.

The determination was made available on OFAC's website (<https://ofac.treasury.gov/>) when it was issued. The text of the determination is provided below.

Determination Pursuant to Section 1(a)(i) of Executive Order 13902

Aviation, Digital Asset, Gold, Shipping, and Technology Sectors of the Iranian Economy

Section 1(a)(i) of Executive Order (E.O.) 13902 of January 10, 2020 ("Imposing Sanctions With Respect to Additional Sectors of Iran") imposes economic sanctions on any person determined by the Secretary of the Treasury, in consultation with the Secretary of State, to operate in such sectors of the Iranian economy as may be determined by the Secretary of the Treasury, in consultation with the Secretary of State.

To further address the unusual and extraordinary threat to the national security, foreign policy, and economy of the United States described in E.O.

13902, and in consultation with the Department of State and pursuant to 31 CFR 560.802, I hereby determine that section 1(a)(i) of E.O. 13902 shall apply to the aviation, digital asset, gold, shipping, and technology sectors of the Iranian economy. Any person determined to operate in these sectors shall be subject to sanctions pursuant to section 1(a)(i).

This determination shall take effect on August 24, 2026.

Safety Zones; Fireworks Displays in the USCG East District—Philadelphia, PA

AGENCY: Coast Guard, DHS.

ACTION: Notification of enforcement of regulation.

SUMMARY: The Coast Guard will enforce a safety zone for the Cooper Foundation Fireworks Display on the Delaware River on September 18, 2026, to provide for the safety of life on navigable waterways during this event. Our regulation for fireworks displays within the USCG East District identifies the regulated area for this event. During the enforcement period, the operator of any vessel in the regulated area must comply with directions from the Patrol Commander or any Official Patrol displaying a Coast Guard ensign.

DATES: The regulations in 33 CFR 165.506, for Philadelphia, PA, will be enforced for the location identified in entry 10 of table 1 to paragraph (h)(1) from 8:30 p.m. through 9:30 p.m. on September 18, 2026.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Coast Guard will enforce a safety zone for the Delaware River, Philadelphia, PA, from

8:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. on September 18, 2026. This action is necessary to ensure safety of life on the navigable waters of the United States immediately prior to, during, and immediately after fireworks displays. Our regulation for safety zones of fireworks displays within the USCG East District, table 1 to paragraph (h)(1) to 33 CFR 165.506, entry 10 specifies the location of the regulated area as all waters of the Delaware River adjacent to Penn's Landing, Philadelphia, PA, within a 500-foot radius of the fireworks barge position. On September 18, 2026, the approximate position will be 39°56'53.65" N, 75°08'03.43" W. During the enforcement period, as reflected in § 165.506(d), vessels may not enter, remain in, or transit through the safety zone unless authorized by the Captain of the Port or designated Coast Guard patrol personnel on-scene.

In addition to this notification of enforcement in the **Federal Register**, the Coast Guard plans to provide notification of this enforcement period via the Local Notice to Mariners and Broadcast Notice to Mariners.

Entry of vessels or persons into this zone is prohibited unless specifically authorized by the Captain of the Port, Sector New York (COTP), or their designated representative.

Background

(b) *Classification*. Class II (special controls). The special controls for this device are:

(1) Clinical performance data must demonstrate the device performs as intended under anticipated conditions of use and evaluate the following:

(i) Radiation dose to adjacent organs at risk;

(ii) Device stability;

(iii) Ability to deploy, expand, and remove the device; and

(iv) Patient comfort.

(2) Non-clinical performance testing must demonstrate that the device performs as intended under anticipated conditions of use. Testing must include:

(i) Testing to evaluate the effect of therapeutic radiation levels on device integrity;

(ii) Bioburden testing to demonstrate the device does not pose an infection risk, if the device is not provided sterile; and

(iii) Structural integrity testing of the container, including tensile strength, container leakage, and burst strength.

(3) Performance testing must demonstrate space creation and maintenance for the duration of a radiation treatment fraction.

(4) The patient-contacting components of the device must be demonstrated to be biocompatible.

(5) Performance data must demonstrate the sterility of patient-contacting components of the device that are provided sterile.

(6) Performance data must support the shelf life of the device by demonstrating package integrity and device functionality over the labeled shelf life.

(7) Labeling must include:

(i) Warnings that:

(A) A three-dimensional imaging method is needed to ensure the device is placed correctly; and

(B) Failure to perform the standard imaging position verification protocol may cause the device to not perform as intended.

(ii) Instructions on how to proceed if the device fails to perform as intended;

(iii) A summary of clinical data relevant to the device, including device-related complications; and

(iv) An expiration date or shelf life.

DATES: Effective September 8, 2026, 31 CFR 560.522, 560.528, and 560.529 are stayed indefinitely.

As of September 8, 2026, the effectiveness of Iran General License J–1, which is available on OFAC's website (<https://ofac.treasury.gov>), is stayed indefinitely.

Background

On October 22, 2012, OFAC issued a final rule that amended the former Iranian Transactions Regulations, 31 CFR part 560 (ITR), and reissued them in their entirety as the Iranian Transactions and Sanctions Regulations (ITSR or “the Regulations”) (77 FR 64664, October 22, 2012). Since then, OFAC has amended the Regulations on several occasions.

On December 15, 2016, OFAC published on its website General License J–1, which was issued pursuant to the Regulations. This general license is available on OFAC's website (www.treasury.gov/ofac).

Rules To Be Stayed

In response to Iran's continued disruptions to global energy markets, attacks on partners and allies in the Middle East, reconstitution of its conventional and nuclear weapons programs, efforts to monetize the Strait of Hormuz, and continued support to terrorist proxies, OFAC is indefinitely

suspending the general licenses and licensing policy contained at 31 CFR 560.522, 560.528, and 560.529. These general licenses and licensing policy authorize, respectively, certain payments for overflights of Iranian airspace; the issuance of specific licenses for certain transactions related to aircraft safety; and bunkering and emergency repairs. As a result of this suspension, any such transactions are no longer authorized by OFAC as of September 8, 2026.

In addition, OFAC is suspending indefinitely Iran General License J–1, published on OFAC's website on December 15, 2016. Iran General License J–1 authorizes the reexportation of certain civil aircraft to Iran on temporary sojourn, as well as related transactions. As a result of this suspension, any such transactions are no longer authorized by OFAC as of September 8, 2026.

Public Participation

Because the Regulations involve a foreign affairs function, the provisions of E.O. 12866 of September 30, 1993, “Regulatory Planning and Review” (58 FR 51735, October 4, 1993), as amended, and the Administrative Procedure Act (5 U.S.C. 553) requiring notice of proposed rulemaking, opportunity for public participation, and delay in effective date, as well as the provisions of E.O. 14192 of January 31, 2025, “Unleashing Prosperity Through Deregulation” (90 FR 9065, February 6, 2025) and E.O. 14219 of February 19, 2025, “Ensuring Lawful Governance and Implementing the President's ‘Department of Government Efficiency’ Deregulatory Initiative” (90 FR 10583, February 25, 2025), are inapplicable. Because no notice of proposed rulemaking is required for this rule, the Regulatory Flexibility Act (5 U.S.C. 601–612) does not apply.

Executive Order 14294

Section 5 of E.O. 14294 of May 9, 2025, “Fighting Overcriminalization in Federal Regulations” (90 FR 20367, May 14, 2025), directs that all future notices of proposed rulemaking (NPRMs) and final rules published in the **Federal Register**, the violation of which may constitute criminal regulatory offenses, should include a statement identifying that the rule or proposed rule is a criminal regulatory offense and the authorizing statute. E.O. 14294 directs agencies to draft this statement in consultation with the Department of Justice.

E.O. 14294 further directs that the regulatory text of all NPRMs and final rules with criminal consequences

published in the **Federal Register** after May 9, 2025 should explicitly state a mens rea requirement for each element of a criminal regulatory offense, accompanied by citations to the relevant provisions of the authorizing statute.

Willful violations of the regulations set forth in this final rule may be subject to criminal penalties pursuant to 50 U.S.C. 1705 and regulations promulgated thereunder. The statutory authority for criminal liability requires a mens rea of willfulness as an element pursuant to 50 U.S.C. 1705(c). In drafting this statement, OFAC has consulted with the Department of Justice.

Paperwork Reduction Act

The Paperwork Reduction Act does not apply because this rule does not impose information collection requirements that would require the approval of the Office of Management and Budget under 44 U.S.C. 3501 *et seq.*

Recognition of Organizations and Individuals To Assist Veterans, Family Members, and Caregivers Navigating Programs and Services of Veterans Health Administration

AGENCY: Department of Veterans Affairs.

SUMMARY: The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) is requesting comments and information to assist VA in implementing the requirements of section 129 of the Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act (Dole Act). Section 129 of the Dole Act requires VA to establish a process to recognize organizations and individuals to assist veterans, their family members, or their caregivers in navigating Veterans Health Administration (VHA) programs and services. We invite comments concerning the proposed process outlined herein for VA to recognize organizations and individuals, including how such organizations and individuals can certify to VA that no fee or compensation will be charged to any individual for services rendered in providing assistance.

I. Background

Section 129(a) of the Dole Act (Pub. L. 118-210) requires VA to establish a process through which VA may recognize organizations and individuals to assist veterans, their family members, or their caregivers (as defined in 38 U.S.C. 1720G(d)) in navigating VHA programs and services. Section 129(b) requires VA to solicit feedback and recommendations in the creation of this process from such organizations as VA may consider relevant. Section 129(c) prohibits VA from recognizing an organization or individual pursuant to this process unless the organization or individual has certified to VA that no fee or compensation of any nature will be charged to any individual for services rendered in providing assistance in navigating VHA programs and services pursuant to section 129(a) of the Dole Act.

Currently, there is no established process for VA to recognize organizations and individuals that assist veterans, their family members, or their caregivers in navigating VHA programs and services. Under 38 U.S.C. 5901-5904, VA may recognize organizations and individuals for the purpose of preparing, presenting, and prosecuting veterans' benefits claims. Pursuant to these authorities, VA has established a robust accreditation, oversight, and fees program. Through this program, VA accredits Veterans Service Organizations (VSO) and their representatives (see 38 U.S.C. 5902 and 38 CFR 14.628 and 14.629(a)), as well as attorneys and claims agents in their individual capacity (38 U.S.C. 5904 and 38 CFR 14.629(b)), to ensure that VA claimants receive competent and qualified representation when pursuing their VA benefit claims. Additionally, VA may use special authorization to recognize individuals who certify that no fees will be charged to the claimant, allowing them to assist with a single claim without accreditation, and in rare

circumstances, assist on multiple claims without accreditation. 38 CFR 14.630(a)-(b). Similar to the health care navigation services that will be provided by organizations and individuals recognized under section 129 of the Dole Act, the claims services provided by VA-accredited VSO representatives and specially authorized individuals are always free to the individuals using those services. However, recognition under section 129 of the Dole Act would be distinct from the recognition process and requirements of 38 U.S.C. 5901-5904. This notice requests information related specifically to section 129 of the Dole Act. Any comments not related to section 129 of the Dole Act will not be considered within the scope of this notice.

II. Consultation With Interested Parties

Section 129(b) of the Dole Act requires VA to solicit feedback and recommendations in the creation of the process from organizations that VA may consider relevant. The proposed process outlined below was developed with feedback from initial listening sessions with the Elizabeth Dole Foundation, the Independence Fund, the National Resource Directory, Operation Homefront, Paralyzed Veterans of America, the Red Cross Military Veteran Caregiver Network, and the Wounded Warrior Project. The feedback and recommendations obtained during these sessions provided a baseline for the draft implementation framework outlined below. Initial feedback from organizations included the types of offerings organizations provide and how they provide resources that assist veterans and their families, caregivers, and survivors with navigating VHA programs and services. Through this request for comments and information, VA is soliciting additional feedback and recommendations from organizations and individuals to help inform VA's recognition process under section 129 of the Dole Act.

III. Assistance in Navigating VHA Programs and Services

VA notes that assistance in navigating programs and services in a health care context is not defined for purposes of section 129 of the Dole Act. However, VA believes there are common factors for what could constitute assistance in navigating in this area. Assistance in navigating VA health programs and services could include guidance offered to potential and existing beneficiaries such as overcoming barriers and facilitating timely, high-quality, patient-

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:

I. Information on the Committee

The LPAC is a statutorily mandated advisory committee that provides PHMSA and the Secretary of Transportation with recommendations on proposed standards for the transportation of hazardous liquid by pipelines. Established in accordance with 49 U.S.C. 60115 and the Federal Advisory Committee Act of 1972 (FACA, 5 U.S.C. Ch. 10), the LPAC is tasked with reviewing and providing recommendations on the technical feasibility, reasonableness, cost-effectiveness, and practicability of PHMSA's proposed changes to the hazardous liquid pipeline safety regulations. The committee consists of 15 members, with membership evenly divided among Federal and State governments, regulated industry, and the general public.

II. Meeting Agenda

The LPAC will meet on Wednesday, October 21, 2026 to discuss the following NPRMs:

1. *Pipeline Safety: Breakout Tank Inspection Rule*, Docket Number PHMSA–2025–1271. PHMSA proposed to update its 49 CFR part 195 regulations for breakout tanks to incorporate the 5th edition of API Std 653 (issued in November 2014 with addendums and errata through July 2025) by reference, and to authorize the use of risk-based inspection procedures for establishing the inspection intervals of in-service breakout tanks.

2. *Pipeline Safety: Remote Monitoring of Hazardous Liquid Pipeline Rectifiers*, Docket Number PHMSA–2026–1550. PHMSA proposed amendments to clarify that required electrical checks of rectifiers and other cathodic protection equipment may be performed remotely on hazardous liquid and carbon dioxide pipelines. This proposal is consistent with standards previously adopted for gas transmission pipelines.

3. *Pipeline Safety: Hazardous Liquid Valve Maintenance Schedule*, Docket Number PHMSA–2026–1554. PHMSA proposed to allow operators of hazardous liquid and carbon dioxide pipelines to determine a valve inspection schedule with a maximum valve inspection interval of one year, not to exceed 15 months.

The LPAC will review the NPRMs and supporting regulatory analyses, including, the preliminary regulatory impact analyses, environmental assessments, and other materials pertaining to the NPRM provided in the respective public docket.

Following the meeting, PHMSA will evaluate the LPAC's recommendations and consider comments received and relevant information from the meeting report in developing any final rules.

III. Public Participation

This virtual meeting will be open to the public. PHMSA also will record the meeting and post a record to the public docket.

Though verbal statements from members of the public will not be permitted during this meeting, PHMSA invites written comments. Members of the public who wish to submit any additional written statement for the Committee's consideration may do so by October 7, 2026. PHMSA also will accept additional written comments after the meeting if received by November 20, 2026.
